## 11.04.1 Purpose

To provide guidelines to sworn members regarding acceptable criteria for effecting an off-duty arrest.

## 11.04.2 Policy

It is the policy of the Georgia Department of Public Safety to set forth guidelines for sworn members making off-duty arrests in order to prevent unnecessary employee injury and exposure to civil liability.

## 11.04.3 Procedures

- A. Liability Protection
  - 1. Liability protection exists for sworn members as long as the member is acting within the scope of their official duties, whether on or off duty.
  - 2. The State, in accordance with the Georgia Torts Claims Act, O.C.G.A. § 50-21-23, shall have no liability for losses resulting from conduct on the part of a member which was not within the scope of the member's official duties and employment.
- B. Authorized Off-Duty Arrests

When off-duty, a member may make an arrest only when:

- 1. The member is the victim of a crime;
- 2. There is an immediate need for the prevention of a crime or apprehension of a suspect;
- 3. The member is requested to do so by an on-duty law enforcement officer;
- 4. Any other circumstances where there is a perception of imminent danger to the public, or
- 5. When the crime is a jailable offense requiring a full custodial arrest.
- C. Restrictions on Off-Duty Arrests

A sworn member should avoid making an arrest off-duty when:

- 1. The member has consumed intoxicants;
- 2. A member, family member or friend has a vested interest/personal gain from the arrest.

- 3. The member is engaged in employment outside the Department of Public Safety and the arrest is only in furtherance of the interest of the private employer;
- 4. The member is involved in a domestic dispute, or
- 5. The arrest is made solely as enforcement of a minor misdemeanor or traffic violation.
- D. General Responsibilities
  - 1. While off-duty, it is the responsibility of the sworn member to immediately report any suspected or observed criminal activity to on-duty law enforcement authorities.
  - 2. When an arrest is necessary and authorized by this directive, the off-duty member shall assume an "on-duty" status and shall exercise their law enforcement authority in compliance with all Georgia Department of Public Safety policies and procedures.
  - 3. It is preferred that the member effecting an arrest possess' Departmental credentials, badge, and firearm.
- E. Reporting Procedures
  - 1. After effecting an off-duty arrest, the member shall notify their Supervisor of the incident as soon as practicable.
  - 2. The Supervisor shall ensure that an appropriate report and subsequent investigation is completed to document the arrest.
  - 3. Within five business days, the member shall submit a memorandum outlining the circumstances of the arrest to the Commanding Officer, through the chain of command.
